TRACK BY TRACK

1. **Dark As The Night, Blue As The Day** (W. Monroe) Vic and Sue sing their broken hearts out on this bluesy rendition of Bill Monroe's classic tale of love gone wrong.
2. **Elephant Mountain** (D. Fraser) Don Fraser's upbeat instrumental is a tip of the hat to his hometown of Nelson, BC. No elephants were harmed in the making of this recording.
3. **Tear My Still House Down** (G. Welch) Another lesson from Bluegrass 101 as Sue sings about the evils of the demon drink.
4. **From Now On** (J. Beazley) Jay Buckwold's roiling banjo drives this tune on to a brighter tomorrow, where energy is green and we all fly around in jet packs.
5. **Forget Me Nots** (V. Smyth, D. Fraser) Vic and Don's lovely old-timey sounding tune is upbeat and - as the members of the Highrise Lonesome orchestra age - bitterly ironic.
6. **Sleepwalk** (S.A. Farina, J. Farina, A. Farina) The dobro soars on this riproarin' take on the classic 50s instrumental. More a Sleeprun, really.
7. **Blue Railroad Train** (A. & R. Delmore) Don and Sue duet on a Delmore Brothers classic. About a train. Which is blue.
8. **Cold Wind Blowing** (D. Fraser) Stu and Sue sing a Don Fraser original comparing stormy love and stormy weather. Trains also figure prominently, riding the rails being au courant and such.
9. **Pineapple Express** (D. Fraser) Another original transports us to a land of gently swaying palm trees. Don's son Michael Fraser scratches some itches you didn't know you had with his sexy electric violin.
10. **Wall Around Your Heart** (V. Smyth) Linda Bull's sweet fiddle shines on Vic's great song about love and construction.
11. **Old Daingerfield** (W. Monroe) Vic kicks things off on the mandolin, then it's hold on tight to the finish.
12. **Love Hurts** (B. Bryant) Vic and Sue warble like heartbroke canaries, stating the obvious for anyone who's stubbed their heart's big toe.
13. **You've Got To Carry On** (S. Malcolm, D. Fraser) Bluegrass Police Warning: Don's son Jamie Fraser kicks things up a notch on the drums while Dad wails on electric guitar. A tribute to our friend, musician and social activist Bob Rosen.
